Hi Forgotten Cats friends!

Our focus for this issue of our newsletter is our growing TNVR efforts in Maryland. At the same time we received additional funding for TNVR in Sussex County, we also received funding from PetSmart Charities® for TNVR in Worcester and Wicomico Counties, MD. We have already TNVR'd over 100 cats from these counties and expect to do 700-800 cats in total with the funding. Much like Sussex County, these two counties in MD are in DESPERATE need of TNVR. We are hearing of very large colonies in multiple locations, and are collaborating with a few local TNVR groups to address the overwhelming free-roaming cat population.

To help support the rescue effort for these Maryland cats, some of whom may be socialized, we have also acquired a brand new PetSmart Adoption Center in Berlin, MD. This will be another outlet for adoptable cats, but will also really help us with community outreach, educating the public on TNVR, the importance of sterilizing your pet, and the services Forgotten Cats provides. **Our grand opening will be during the next PetSmart National Adoption Event, May 19th!**

Volunteer Spotlight on Martin Stepper

Martin Stepper may be retired from his career as an IT professional, but he's not retired from keeping busy. Like many of our volunteers, he works a lot of hours and wears many hats.

He manages the Pet Valu adoption center in Jenkintown, one of our new locations. This involves coordinating volunteer coverage, working with store management, hosting meet & greets, processing applications, serving as an adoption counselor, and of course



making sure the kitties are well cared for and as comfortable as possible. As a new adoption center, this location doesn't have as much volunteer coverage as desired just yet, but the store has good foot traffic and a steady pace of adoptions.

Martin also spends one evening a week doing a feed & clean shift at the PetSmart in Jenkintown, and helps out at adoption events there. He is very thankful for having people like Kelly Gubitosa and Sue Silverman (co-managers of that adoption center) provide the guidance and oversight needed to deal with potential adopters as well as the cats.

He began volunteering with Forgotten Cats six years ago, followed by his wife Marka, also a cat lover. On Wednesdays they work together at the Willow Grove clinic helping take care of the downstairs

cats, incoming trapped cats, and sometimes, cats recovering from spay & neuter surgery. Martin credits clinic volunteer Terry Greiner for being a huge help to him, as well as being an amazing person. He said she always knows just which clinic or foster cats to send to Pet Valu.

Martin has two adult children and two young grandchildren which bring joy to his life. He lives in Elkins Park, PA with Marka and their 10 rescue cats. There's Katrina, Purrcy, Henry, Skittles, Lana, Spice, Lewis, Clark, Butters and Vyolet. (Vyolet was given the unusual spelling to distinguish her from the many other Violets in the Forgotten Cats database.)

After receiving his undergraduate degree from Syracuse University and teaching for a few years, Martin worked in the IT field. He retired from Johnson & Johnson in New Brunswick, NJ after working there for the last 20 years of his career.

His fellow volunteers may not know that Martin is a very talented musician! He is a graduate of the highly prestigious Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, one of the world's leading music schools, where he studied piano and composition.
